Rules:

1. Fruit entered should be of show quality. Entries will be accepted between 9 am and 6 pm on entry day. Late entries will be displayed but not judged.
2. The number written after the type of fruit indicates quantity to be submitted.
3. The fruit should be as close to perfection as possible - ripe, or slightly under ripe so it will last several days on display.
4. All fruit should be of uniform size and shape as uniformity is more important to the Judge than large size.
5. Enter fruit with good representative color, a minimum of blemishes, and without bruises, damage, insect or larval infestations.
6. All fruit (except blackberries, boysenberries, loganberries, tayberries, blueberries, gooseberries, raspberries, and nuts) should have their stems left intact.
7. Autumn ripening fruit will not be mature in August but will be shown alongside others grown in similar conditions and judged as representative of that type or variety.
8. Enter by variety name whenever possible, so that others may benefit from your experience.
9. The Superintendent may refuse entries or remove exhibits which are unsightly because of damage, decay, wilting or infestation.
